The Quest for Wellness Health Tourism:

Jet-Setting for a Jolly Fix

Utilizing the Quals.ai platform, an Al-powered qualitative research tool, we conducted 160 interviews in Germany and the UK between January 25-29, 2025. This included 80 participants who had previously traveled to Turkey for medical tourism and 80 who had not. Quals.Al conducted the interviews, analysed the conversations and came up with the insights.





Health tourism is not just about hopping on a plane for a medical procedure; it's about the complete experience of combining care with travel. Germans equate health tourism with affordable healthcare. Brits are focused on cosmetic procedures.

It's a mix of excitement and caution, with those who've taken the plunge often singing its praises, while the yet-to-be-converted remain skeptical, influenced by the media's horror stories.



"Health tourism is like a free holiday. You get healthy, and you get to travel!" (Germany, Female, 36)

"I associate health tourism with aesthetic surgeries and dental treatments. I'd try it if I had the chance, but the media scares me." (UK, Male, 47)

"To me, health tourism is about not just saving money but also getting quality service." (Germany, Male, 48)



The allure of health tourism largely hinges on cost savings. Germans love the combo of affordable and quality service, while the Brits are lured by low prices but spooked by potential risks. Concerns about aftercare, language barriers, and insurance are common themes.



Those who've yet to venture abroad for treatments tend to focus on these worries, while the seasoned travelers among us highlight their successful trips and the money they've saved.





"Waiting times and high private care costs on the NHS pushed me to look abroad." (UK, Male, 53)

"It's not just about cost savings, it's also about getting things done quicker."
(Germany, Male, 31)

"I'm worried about having to return for follow-ups, which could cost me more."
(Germany, Male, 45)

Turkey's Rising Star

Turkey emerges as a hot spot in the world of health tourism, with many Germans praising its affordability and quality services. Brits, on the other hand, can't help but mention the infamous "Turkey teeth" and other cosmetic stereotypes.

Those who've dipped their toes in Turkey's healthcare waters often return with tales of satisfaction and savings, while the skeptics remain wary of media horror stories.






"I trust Turkish doctors' expertise, and my friends' experiences have been positive so that I had to do it." (Germany, Male, 39)

Turkey stands out as an appealing destination, offering cost savings and perceived quality, yet some are still hesitant.
